INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

**To: Founders and Management of
Charity Fund *BLAGOMAY***

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of the Charity Fund *BLAGOMAY* (hereinafter referred to as the Charity Fund), which comprise the Balance Sheet as of December 31, 2023 and the Statement on Financial Results for the year ended on the mentioned date.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements of the Charity Fund is prepared in all material respects in accordance with the Ukrainian Accounting Standard No. 25 *Simplified financial statements* and other UAS applied for small enterprises and meet the requirements of the Law of Ukraine No. 996-XIV *On Accounting and Financial Statements in Ukraine* dated 16.07.1999 (hereinafter – the Law No. 996-XIV) regarding the preparation of financial statements.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are independent of the Charity Fund in accordance with the International Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants adopted by the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants (hereinafter referred to as the IESBA), as well as ethical requirements applied in Ukraine to our audit of the financial statements and have performed other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the IESBA Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified opinion.

Other issues

(i) Significant Uncertainty Regarding Going Concern

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the basis of the assumption that the Charity Fund is able to continue as a going concern. From February 24, 2022, the impact of ongoing military operations in Ukraine, the scope of their further development, the timing of the cessation of these operations, and the final settlement of the conflict are unpredictable. These conditions create a material uncertainty about the Charity Fund's ability to continue as a going concern. The UAS No. 25 *Simplified Financial Statements* does not require disclosure of the Management's plans regarding these issues in the financial statements. When preparing the financial statements, the Management came to the conclusion that these conditions did not adversely affect the activities of the Charity Fund and that the going concern assumption is applicable. Our opinion has not been modified on this matter.

Responsibilities of the Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation of the financial statements in accordance with the requirements of the UAS, and for such internal control as the Management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, Management is responsible for assessing the Charity Fund's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters relating to going concern and using the going concern assumption as a basis for accounting unless Management either intends to liquidate the Charity Fund or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Charity Fund's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an Auditor's Report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with ISAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with the ISAs, we use professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control;
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the internal control;
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by the Management;
- Conclude on the appropriateness of the Management's use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Charity Fund's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Charity Fund to cease to continue as a going concern.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.
