


«Blagomay HUB»

Blagomay HUB is a safe educational space for teenagers where they receive allround support, knowledge, and practical skills for socialization and preparation for adult life.

Special attention in 2024 was given to creative camps, which included 6 shifts. In addition, teenagers received 270 psychological consultations, which helped them adapt better to modern challenges.































































Cultural Code of Ukraine





Cooperation with UN Clusters

The charitable fund "Blagomay" actively collaborates with UN clusters. On a permanent basis, the fund reports on implemented activities across Ukraine within the following six clusters:





SNFI Cluster Ukraine (Shelter/Non-Food Items Cluster)

A coordination mechanism that unites efforts within international humanitarian aid in Ukraine. Its mission is to ensure access to proper shelter and non-food items (NFI) for people affected by conflict in Ukraine.



A coordination mechanism operating under the global leadership of the Global Education Cluster. Its goal is to ensure access to quality education in emergencies for children and youth affected by the conflict in Ukraine.



FSI Cluster Ukraine (Food Security and Livelihoods Cluster)

A coordination mechanism addressing the systemic response to food security and livelihood needs for crisis-affected people in Ukraine. It is led by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO).

GBV Sub-Cluster Ukraine (Gender-Based Violence Sub-Cluster)

A coordination mechanism operating under the Protection Cluster. Its goal is to ensure a coordinated response to genderbased violence (GBV) in Ukraine, especially in the context of the armed conflict. Such cooperation makes it possible to receive all the necessary information about the work of other funds and the state in various areas. This prevents duplication of assistance for beneficiaries and also makes it possible to distribute assistance evenly.



WASH Cluster (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene)

A coordination mechanism uniting humanitarian organizations, governments, donors, and partners to ensure access to safe water, sanitation, and hygiene for people affected by crises.



Health Cluster Ukraine

A coordination mechanism ensuring systemic health response to the needs of crisis-affected people in Ukraine. It operates under the leadership of the World Health Organization (WHO).

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

We have audited the financial statements of the Charity Fund "BLAGOMAY" (hereinafter referred to as the Charity Fund), which comprise the Balance Sheet as of December 31, 2024, and the Statement of Financial

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements of the Charity Fund have been prepared, in all erial respects, in accordance with the National Accounting Standard (Regulation) No. 25 "Simplified Financial Statements" and other national accounting standards applicable to small enterprises and comply with the requirements of the Law of Ukraine "On Accounting and Financial Reporting in Ukraine" dated July 16, 1999, No. 996-XIV (hereinafter referred to as Law No. 996-XIV) regarding financial reporting.

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISA), Our responsibilities under those standards are described in the "Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements" section of our report. We are independent of the Charity Fund in accordance with the International Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (including International Inde Standards) issued by the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants ("IESBA Code") and the ethical requirements applicable in Ukraine to our audit of the financial statements. We have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the IESBA Code. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion

The financial statements have been prepared on the assumption that the Charity Fund will continue as a going concern. Since February 24, 2022, the ongoing military actions in Ukraine, their further evelopment, the timeline for cessation, and the final resolution of the conflict remain unpredictable These conditions create significant uncertainty regarding the Charity Fund's ability to continue as a going concern. National Accounting Standard (Regulation) No. 25 does not require disclosure of management plans regarding these matters in the financial statements. In preparing the financial statements management has concluded that these conditions have not adversely affected the Fund's activities and that the going concern assumption is appropriate. Our opinion has not been modified in respect of this

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation of the financial statements in accordance with the applicable national accounting standards and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Charity Fund's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, where applicable, matters related to going concern, and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Charity Fund or to cease operations or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of

As part of an audit in accordance with ISA, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error. as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Charity Fund's Internal control
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by management.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of management's use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Charity Fund's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in ou auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Charity Fund to cease to continue as a going concern.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.


